In their work cohesion is described as, "a semantic one, it refers to relations of meaning that exist within the texts, and that define it as a text" (Halliday & Hasan, 1976, p. 10).

## **Halliday and Hasan in Cohesion in English (1976) see text ...**

Lexical cohesion is simply interpreted by Halliday and Hasan (1976:274) as "the cohesive effect achieved by the selection of vocabulary". It involves meaningful connections in text that are created through the use of lexical items and that do not intrinsically involve grammatical cohesive ties (Bloor, 2004).

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## **Cohesion in English - M.A.K. Halliday, Ruqaiya Hasan ...**

Cohesion is the semantic relation between one element and another in a text (Halliday & Hasan, 1976). A text is cohesive when the elements are tied together and considered meaningful to the reader. Cohesion occurs when the interpretation of one item depends on the other, i.e. one item presupposes the other (Halliday & Hasan, 1976).

Cohesion is the grammatical and lexical linking within a text or sentence that holds a text together and gives it meaning. It is related to the broader concept of coherence. There are two main types of cohesion: grammatical cohesion, which is based on structural content—and lexical cohesion, which is based on lexical content and background knowledge. Cohesion in its broadest sense is “a semantic relation between an element in [a] text and some other element that is crucial to the interpretation of it” (HALLIDAY & HASAN 1994:8).
